Tanzania Safari

January 21 – February 4, 2027 15 Days

Few places on earth remain as genuinely, breathtakingly wild as Tanzania. This is the real Africa, raw and unhurried, where the wilderness stretches unbroken to every horizon. Tanzania delivers full immersion: a landscape so vast and so alive that every morning in the field feels like a privilege. It's a place where wonder is never manufactured but rather waiting to be found.

We'll start in Tarangire National Park, where enormous herds of elephants, sometimes numbering in the hundreds, gather along the riverbanks, while lions, giraffes, zebras, and antelopes roam freely across a landscape that feels unchanged in a world that often chases modernization. The ancient baobab trees that punctuate the horizon have stood here for thousands of years, sheltering birds, monkeys, and memories alike.

From there, we descend into the Ngorongoro Crater, a natural wonder unlike anywhere else. This vast, unbroken caldera, stretching 102 square miles, cradles one of Africa's greatest concentrations of wildlife: black rhinos, hippos, elephants, and what may be the highest density of lions anywhere on the continent.

Our journey culminates on the endless plains of the Serengeti, where January and February bring the dramatic calving season of the Great Migration, one of the most awe-inspiring wildlife spectacles on earth. More than 1.5 million wildebeest, alongside hundreds of thousands of zebra and gazelle, fill the landscape as far as the eye can see. A visit to Oldupai Gorge, the cradle of mankind, adds a humbling and deeply moving dimension to an already remarkable adventure.

Throughout the trip, we'll stay in outstanding lodges and luxury tented camps, all with private baths. Safari drives are conducted in comfortable 4x4 vehicles with pop-up tops, and every traveler is guaranteed a window seat. The pace is relaxed and unhurried, designed to let you soak in every extraordinary moment. This is a once-in-a-lifetime journey, and every detail has been carefully curated to ensure it exceeds expectations.

Colombia: Central Andes and Santa Marta

January 16 – 27, 2027 12 Days

In recent years, Colombia has quickly risen through the ranks as one of the most highly sought-after birding destinations. With over 1,900 species of birds, it's the most diverse country on the planet! From the towering Andes to legendary Santa Marta, this new adventure is a great introduction to South American birding. Among the Andes, we'll visit multiple elevations, including feeding stations for normally shy antpittas, and have the chance of spotting nearly 60 different species of hummingbirds. A visit to Santa Marta, a small mountain range on the Caribbean coast, will bring with it a host of new species. This isolated range is home to over 20 species found nowhere else in the world, including some that are still being discovered!

Panama's Famous Canopy Family

February 19 – March 1, 2027 11 Days

Few names are as synonymous with birding in Panama as the Canopy Family. Since 1999, with the conversion of an old American radar tower into a birding lodge and observation deck, birders have flocked to Panama for the unique experience. We'll spend time at both Canopy Tower and Canopy Lodge, searching for wildlife from the banks of the Panama Canal to the mountain valleys. Witness their world-famous feeders in person, and enjoy the comfort of this iconic birding destination.

Casual Costa Rica

March 5 – 13, 2027 9 Days

With over 900 species in a country the size of West Virginia, many struggle with where to start exploring when visiting Costa Rica. This trip is the perfect introduction to tropical birding, at a slow pace and with a casual setting. Focusing on birding at elevation to avoid excessive heat, we'll explore the region in search of many iconic species, including Snowcap, Resplendent Quetzal, and Sunbittern. With luck, we'll find some range-restricted species. This is a great trip for those interested in birding the tropics but are worried about long drives.

Guatemala: Birds and Mayan Ruins

March 14 – 22, 2027 9 Days

The tiny country of Guatemala, with its ancient Mayan culture and history, volcanic vistas, and incredible birdlife, is a dream come true for the adventure traveler. Guatemala is home to more than 700 species of birds, many of which are unique to northern Central America. Travel to cloud forest and tropical rain forest, from the Pacific Slope to the central highlands, in search of Guatemala's many regionally endemic species. The Tikal portion of the trip opens views into the Mayan past from atop pyramids nestled within tropical splendor. Its unique history and geography, combined with a modern tourist infrastructure, good roads, comfortable lodges, and inviting food, have made Guatemala a premier destination. Don't miss out on a trip to remember!

Peru: Machu Picchu and the Sacred Valley

We'll also sail across Lake Titicaca, travel by train to the famous city of Cusco, visit one of the world's deepest canyons, and search for Andean Condor, the largest land bird in the Americas. With hikes to ruins and the chance to relax in some of the finest hot springs imaginable, this tour uses great lodging for a one-of-a-kind, memorable adventure.

Finland's Boreal Breeders

May 14 – 21, 2027 8 Days

Finland's boreal forests are famous for their incredible owl diversity during breeding season. Great Gray, Ural, Boreal, Eurasian Pygmy, Short-eared, Northern Hawk, and Long-eared owls are all possible, even though numbers fluctuate year by year. This adventure is dedicated to searching not only for all the owls, but other northern specialties including Western Capercaillie and Siberian Tit. With luck, we'll hopefully also locate a Eurasian Three-toed Woodpecker, another highly sought after species of northern Europe. The cool weather is a great way to ease into the summer season! This trip has the option to be combined with **Norway: Birding the Arctic Circle** for an in-depth Scandinavian experience.

The largest landlocked country in the world, Kazakhstan is often overlooked by birders. With a vast length equal to the size of Western Europe, the Kazakh Steppe region is the world's largest steppe habitat, covered in grasslands and sandy regions. We'll journey across the steppe into the mountains, exploring the habitat that has largely avoided human interference. Some of the main targets include the critically endangered Sociable Lapwing, White-winged and Black larks, and Demoiselle Crane. Join us on our inaugural trip to this incredible destination and have an intimate encounter with Central Asia and its rarely seen wildlife.

Southern Spain: Solar Eclipse

July 28 – August 5, 2027 9 Days

Dominated by a Mediterranean climate, Andalusia is the most biodiverse region in Spain and helps to make Spain the most biodiverse country in all of Europe. In 2027, a total solar eclipse will pass directly over the region, creating a spectacular backdrop. While the eclipse will be the main focus of the trip, we'll visit surrounding parks in search of Iberian Lynx, Greater Flamingos, and more. We'll also experience the culture and historical significance of the region, visiting wineries, Bronze Age burial sites, and Roman ruins. In the evenings, you'll have time to explore historic downtowns. This is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that you don't want to miss!

Uganda: Gorillas and Chimpanzees

August 7 – 19, 2027 13 Days

In the heart of East Africa lies Uganda. Dubbed the "Pearl of Africa" by Winston Churchill during a 1907 visit, the country is home to expansive national parks and reserves that protect a wide variety of habitats. From unique tree-climbing lions to famous mountain gorillas and chimpanzees, there's an incredible opportunity to witness the stunning beauty of this landlocked country. A morning will also be spent along the shore of Lake Victoria searching for the iconic Shoebill, one of the most unique-looking birds on the planet. This prehistoric-looking bird, with huge, yellow human-like eyes and a clog-shaped bill is high on the wish lists of many nature lovers. With comfortable lodges with breathtaking views, this trip is a great adventure for those ready to explore the "Pearl of Africa!" Both the chimpanzee and gorilla tracking adventures are included in the cost!

Wildlife is amazingly abundant here; its seasonally flooded plains attract immense numbers of birds and caiman and are some of the most mammal-rich areas of South America. On this adventure, we'll travel from the lowlands, where we'll search for jaguars and giant otters by boat, to the breathtaking mountain peaks and waterfalls of Chapada dos Guimarães National Park. This adventure brings you to the geographic center of South America, in search of iconic species that are difficult to see elsewhere.

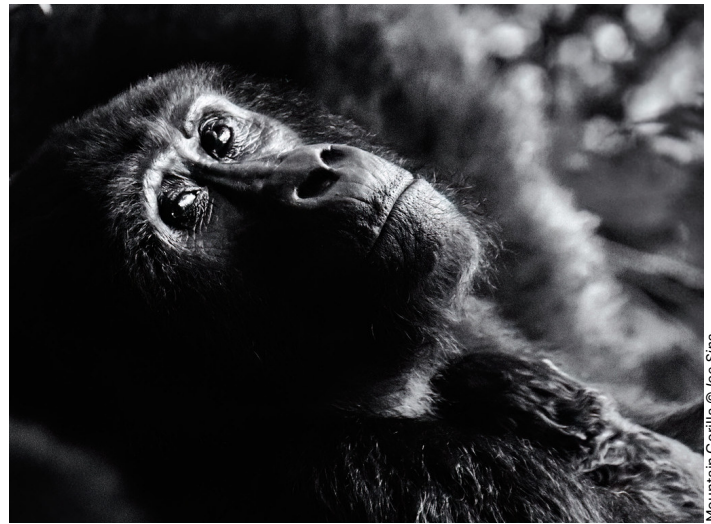

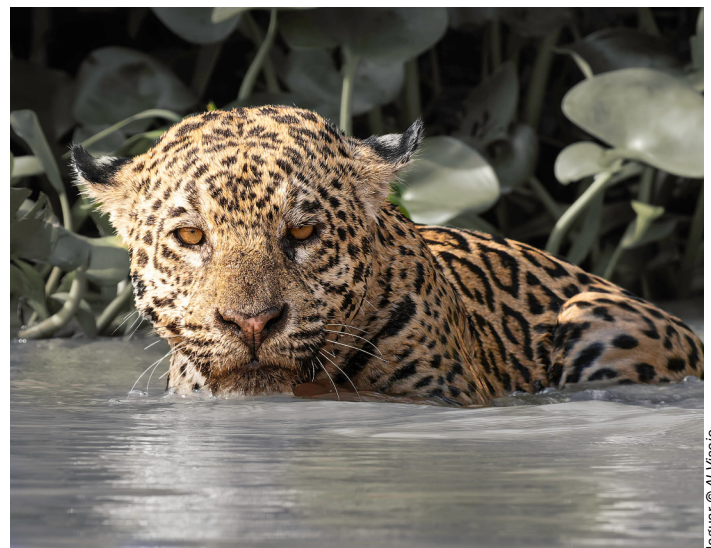

Flame Robins bring pops of color to the barren grasslands while a wildlife sanctuary on Bruny Island is home to one of the largest colonies of Forty-spotted Pardalote. Eyes should be kept peeled for the iconic Platypus, which can be found across the island. This adventure can be combined with the **Southeast Australia: Coast to Outback** for an Ultimate Tour.

Cape Ann: Boston's North Shore

January 7 – 10, 2027 4 Days

Just north of Boston, this area plays host to many species of migratory birds that are not commonly seen in Connecticut. Considered by many to be one of the top birding spots in North America, the North Shore, with its spectacular coastline, is keeper of such well-known names as Newburyport, Gloucester, Marblehead, Plum Island, and Cape Ann. Travelers will explore the rich coastline to enjoy marine mammals, winter sea ducks, pelagic birds, and the unexpected. We'll look for Dovekie, Thick-billed Murre, King Eider, and more.

Winter Owl Blitz: Sax-Zim Bog

January 31 – February 5, 2027 6 Days

For many people, the first images that come to mind when thinking of Minnesota winters are of cold, snow, ice, and frozen lakes. To birders, those images exist only as a glittering backdrop for Great Gray and Northern Hawk owls hunting from spruce-top perches; Ruffed Grouse stripping the buds from birches by morning's glowing light; flocks of colorful Pine and Evening grosbeaks filling-up at bird feeders; frenzied redpolls darting about an alder thicket; and tamarack bogs occupied by industrious Black-backed and American Three-toed woodpeckers. Venture into the North, searching for the rare and breathtaking species that call the boreal forests home.

Puerto Rico: Island Endemics

February 7 – 13, 2027 7 Days

Many North American nesting birds spend the winter in tropical regions in the Caribbean, including Puerto Rico. Although the island measures only 35 miles north to south and 100 miles east to west—about two-thirds the size of Connecticut—over 350 species have been recorded. It also features 17 endemic species (more than the entire Lower 48!) along with 25 species endemic to the West Indies. Enjoy a winter getaway to warm breezes and great bird species, including Elfin-woods Warbler, Puerto Rican Tody, and the critically endangered Puerto Rican Parrot.

Dauphin Island, Alabama

April 11 – 17, 2027 7 Days

To the east of world-famous High Island, Texas, lies little-known Dauphin Island, just south of Mobile, Alabama. Often overlooked by birders, it's one of the first stretches of land that neotropical migrants see as they make their way across the Gulf of Mexico. Dauphin Island is where birds congregate to rest and refuel after the exhausting flight, sometimes through inclement weather. It's not uncommon to have over 100 species in just a single day! Time will be spent searching not only for migrant songbirds, but also for resident southern specialties, shorebirds getting ready to leave their wintering grounds, and more. This adventure is centered around one hotel and is a perfect way to welcome migration.

Witness one of the most spectacular avian events when thousands of Tree Swallows congregate on the lower Connecticut River at sunset to settle in on a giant communal roost during their fall migration. Birds come from miles away, creating a ballet of synchronized flight before settling down for the night. Renowned ornithologist and artist Roger Tory Peterson wrote that "the tornadoes of Tree Swallows eclipsed any other avian spectacle I have ever seen." Join Connecticut Audubon naturalists and journey from Essex, by train and then by boat, to see the awe-inspiring display. Enjoy picturesque scenery from the 70-foot Mississippi-style river boat's three decks. Snacks, a full bar, and restrooms are available on board. If you take only one trip this fall, make sure it's this one! *Tours are approximately 3.5 hours in length and vary in departure time from 3:30 to 5 p.m., depending on the date chosen (the later in the month, the earlier the departure time). Tours depart from the Essex Steam Train & River Boat in Essex. Appropriate for children 8 years and older.* Fee: \$55.

Board the *Cecelia Ann*, a 143-foot catamaran, in **New London** for a tour of the Sound's eastern lighthouses, including lights at Old Saybrook, Little Gull Island, Race Rock, Plum Island, and the famous Bug Light near Greenport, New York.
